Through interactive exercise, learn what happens when the bodies digest food. Get up and moving to learn how air enters and exits the body. A face mask and gloves will make students feel like real surgeons as they learn to suture and tie knots! Our mission is to teach elementary and middle school children about the exciting field of medicine. C. & K. Arnold - This class encourages elementary school children to role play and explore the exciting world of veterinarians. The students will get their very own stuffed animal puppy. Using interactive demonstrations, crafts and games, kids learn how to take care of a pet and use instruments that real veterinarians use. We will learn how to measure and take assessments of their pet dog, and learn the importance of proper nutrition and eating proper foods in keeping a dog healthy and growing properly. Learn what to do when a dog gets hurt and how to care for stitches. Learn the importance of ticks and how to check for ticks. They will learn how to administer tick medicine. Learn and discuss how antibodies recognize and kill germs that enter the body. This is a 10-week STEM-based class. *Literacy Library*
