Questions & Answers

Q: What will happen to projects not included in the committee's bond recommendation?

A: Projects will remain as part of the long-range master plan for future considerations. The district's facility needs will continue to be reassessed to ensure we are best serving our students and community.

Q: Are voters who live in Friendswood but are zoned to Clear Creek ISD schools able to vote in the potential Friendswood ISD bond election?

A: No. Only voters who are zoned to Friendswood ISD schools will be able to vote in a potential bond election.

Q: What's the ideal lot size for a new school? Would this existing Cline Elementary site work?

A: The existing Cline site could be adequate with a two-story design. However, there are major site infrastructure issues to consider. An ideal elementary site should be accessed by three to two roads at a minimum. The existing site access is a major concern that cannot be addressed.

Q: Are there additional city bond propositions on the ballot next year?

A: No.

Q: When we get questions about the potential bond that we cannot answer, who can we reach out to at Friendswood ISD?

A: You can reach out to Tammy Locklear, and she will connect you with the right individual to answer your question.

Committee Member Comment: I want to emphasize the importance of being aware of voter apathy. I've seen bonds fail by 65 votes, and I've seen bonds pass by less than that.
